OPEN CLASSES

A.V. Imperial Grand Champion Male

IMP – Johnson’s GD CH INLAY JOOP VAN SCALINDJO (Import) (48) M 28/06/05. A strong and handsome male of very good type. Longer wedge with good top of head, ears large and set to virtually balance. Oval shaped eyes well set with good expression and pale green colour. Straight strong profile with broad nose, good chin, bite lacks incisors but appears level. Weighty and well muscled body of good length, long strong limbs and good tail to balance. Attractive Bicolour pattern with black areas, over back head and tail, dense and sound. White areas to just over the one third required with invert “v” to nose, across the chest, down the limbs and with a fairly broad complete line down the tummy. Well prepared as always with only minimal bleeding to the edges of the two colours. If I were to nit pick his coat was a little soft and fine today, but the length was good and it laid close to body. Excellent to handle, very handsome and imposing male, excellently presented.

R – Cassar-Simmonds’ GD CH CIATRA BASHFUL BRUNO (37) M 12/01/08.

Another very handsome boy, more flashy than the winner, one or two minor things put him down to Reserve today. Excellent head type, broad strong and very stylish with wide top line and large wide based ears excellently set. Oriental eye shape and set with wicked expression and olive green colour. Profile not quite straight with dip centre nose, good chin with depth, bite lacks incisors but appears to be level. Long very elegant body, of good weight but lacking muscle over the spine today, limbs long, tapered tail almost balances. Dense black coat, marginally long and a little fine in texture but sound to roots – has one or two paler hairs in the groin area that Daddy should have tidied up! An easy boy to handle, pen presentation excellent.

Siamese/Balinese Imperial Grand Premier Male

IMP – Crowley & Lambert’s GD PR JOHPAS RAPHAEL (32fn) MN 09/05/08.

A stylish male neuter. Balanced head with very good top and large flared ears set wide. Oriental shape set and expression to eyes of mid blue colour, haws up a touch today. Strong profile, chin has good depth and lines up with the nose tip, bite missing many incisors but looked reasonably level. Very long body, substantial without sacrificing elegance and the tone was good for a neuter, long limbs, tapered tail just about balances. Points colour looked very good despite the hall lighting not being particularly helpful to red series cats today, there were good hot tones to ears and tail. Coat off white with quite heavy shading, some contrast still seen, medium in length, texture a touch soft today but lies well. A relaxed and friendly boy who was easy to handle. Excellently presented.

A.C. British Colourpointed (exc Cinnamon & Fawn) Kitten

1st & BOB – Camm’s DIXYLAN CHRISTMAS ANGEL (40/12) F 05/10/10. A lovely little baby, promising for type, perhaps a touch small, but weighty and well covered. Well rounded head with good breadth of skull and small neat ears with rounded tips, set well, whisker pads a touch prominent at present. Round eyes showing spectacles, with open expression and clear blue colour. Gently rounded forehead curving to short broad nose, a good firm chin lines up with the nose tip, bite level. Shorter length body which promises to be cobby, with short legs and neat round paws, very good tail, thick at root and tapered to a rounded tip. Soft blue tabby markings with “M” developing, well defined evenly spaced ringing right along the length of the tail, very pale barring to limbs at present. Coat typically baby for length and texture, a touch long and slightly soft, glacial in tone with some light shading to tone over the back which possibly could clear as she grows. Lovely to handle, a confident baby very well presented.

2nd – Knapp’s KERNMORE DREAMALITTLEDREAM (40/9) F 08/08/10. A slightly older kitten, quite dainty for 6 months and for my personal taste somewhat extreme in type. Rounded head with small neat ears that are set a little high at present. Eyes of correct shape but on the small side and deep set, colour clear blue. Forehead could be a little more rounded but does curve slightly to short broad nose, very strong, deep chin and level bite. Medium length cobby body with a good weighty feel to it, short strong limbs and round paws, medium length tail with rounded tip. Darker chocolate tortie points, well mingled in paler and medium red, almost matching on all points. Excellent coat, really short dense and crisp, ivory in colour and virtually unshaded. A friendly girl very well presented.

3rd – Hutson’s TAKEITEZE BELOTHEBLUE (40/2) F 01/07/10. A well developed girl of good type. Well rounded head with smallish ears that are set a mite close at present and have a tendency to bonnet. Gently rounded forehead curving to short broad nose, deep firm chin and level bite. Good expression to well rounded eyes of paler blue with a hint of pale yellow at the rim. Excellent substance to strong cobby body, short strong legs and round paws, tail thick at root and rounded at the tip but long for balance. Points a rather muddy looking blue with tail a good deal darker. Coat long and soft in texture, not strictly glacial in tone and has a fair amount of fawnish blue shading. An easy girl to handle and presented well.

MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

A V British Limit Male

1st – Hiron’s HIRONVADE DR JAZZ (30a) M 10/05/10. A well developed chap of very good type. Good head type with broad skull and full cheeks, ears small and neat, following the rounded contours of the head. Rounded forehead and short broad nose, firm chin and level bite. Round eyes with open expression and excellent intense copper colour. Chunky cobby body with broad chest, short strong limbs and large rounded paws, medium length tail with round tip. Mid blue spotted pattern on mushroom coloured ground, shows some linkage of the spots behind the fore arms, spots mainly well rounded, well defined and reasonably sound, with broken spine line and bracelets, has several broken necklaces, and evenly ringed tail. Coat short, could be a little crisper in texture but has good density. Excellent temperament, a very friendly boy well presented.

2nd - DELPHINIUM BOMBADIER (16) M 11/05/10. A well developed boy for his age, of good type. Well rounded head with good breadth, and full cheeks, ears could perhaps be touch smaller, but were nicely rounded at the tip and were set well apart to follow the contours of the skull. Rounded forehead with short broad nose, good firm chin and level bite. Good eye shape with open expression, colour gold. Fairly cobby body with good broad chest, typically adolescent at present, but with the promise of muscle tone and substance to come, short strong legs and round paws, tail medium in length with rounded tip. Dark blue coat, short and fairly dense but a little soft in texture, free from tipping but marginally unsound today. A handsome boy with an excellent temperament, presented well.

3rd – Parr’s PARRADAZY PICASSO (40/4) M 23/05/10. An attractive lad of good type but still very much a big baby. Well rounded head with cheeks beginning to show, small ears set well apart with rounded forehead and short broad nose, good chin and level bite. Cobby body with short strong limbs and good tail. Soft frosty toned points colour, well matched on all points. Short magnolia coat with the bare minimum of shading, quite crisp to the touch but could be denser. A happy boy promises to be very nice when he has matured. Well presented.

A.V. British Limit Female

1st - Martin’s WELLMAR HOIPOLOI (22a) F 09/08/09. Mature lady of very good type. Typical head type, nicely rounded with smallish ears set well apart, gently rounded forehead with lovely short broad nose, deep firm chin and level bite. Good eye shape with open expression and mid copper colour. Body medium in length, cobby and weighty with short limbs and round paws, medium length tail to balance. Very attractive balance between blue and cream, the blue areas are a medium tone and the cream patches are fairly pale. White to just over the third, with inverted “v” to head, on all four limbs, right across the chest and down the tummy. Excellent coat, short dense and crisp. An easy girl to handle immaculately presented.

2nd – Chance’s CRAZIPUSS SILENT PROMISE (30es) F 11/04/10. A very attractive lady who ran the winner quite close. Good type, rounded head with good breadth of skull and full cheeks, ears smallish and set well apart. Gently curved forehead, short broad nose, chin could be a touch firmer, bite level. Open expression to eyes. hazel in colour. Cobby body with very good substance, short strong legs with round paws, medium length tail thick at root rounded at the tip. Paler black spotting to coat, with plentiful patches of muted red on paler silver ground. Spotting extensively linked on the left side, better on the right where they are nicely rounded, spine line well broken, has several broken necklaces and paler bracelets. Coat very good for length and texture with a lovely scrunchy feel to it. Excellent temperament and presentation.

3rd –Hutchinson’s ZINGFRO TIGERLILY (16) F 19/06/09. A good sized girl of good type. Well rounded head with full cheeks, ears could be a little smaller, they are set well apart but she does tend to bonnet them. Nicely curved forehead, nose broad and straight but marginally long, chin could be a little firmer but bite level. Good shape and expression to eyes, the colour is a mid gold but there appears to be a hint of a green-ish inner ring. Cobby body with very good substance, short legs and round paws, tail good. Darker blue coat that was quite unsound and showing some slight

silvery tipping in places, it was short and dense but rather soft in texture. Handled well and was well presented.

A.V Oriental Breeders Adult Female.

1st – Moore’s CH KINKAJEWSDEN ALANNAH (37d) F 27/05/08. A stylish red female with very good type. Typy head with very good top line and large flared ear set to balance. Very good eye shape and set with naughty expression, she lurked under her blanket threatening all and sundry but in actual fact handled quite well for all her protests. Good red coat of very good length and texture, a little light pattern evident but red to roots. Excellently presented.

2nd – Parkinson’s MAUG NANDA (43bs) F 19/05/10. An attractive female quite dainty as yet and looking her 9 months of age at present. Type good with nicely balanced head and good green eyes. Excellent coat pattern, a ticked-based shaded with the shading right on the hair tips. Shown in excellent condition.

3rd – Hirst’s TOGHAR HEAVENSENTME (29) F 18/05/10 Stylish Havana girl but still a baby in terms of development. Well balanced head with very good top, good eye shape set and expression with good green colour. Warm tones to coat, it was mostly sound but a little long today with the texture rather too fine. Excellent to handle

A.V. Oriental Not bred by Exhibitor Adult

1st - Johnson’s GD CH INLAY JOOP VAN SCALINDJO (Import) (48) M 28/06/05

2nd – Brownrigg’s BECKSTAR FANTASIA (37e) F 09/04/10. A young miss with a lovely even and well balanced head and butterfly ears set wide. Very good eye shape set and expression with clear mid green colour. Dainty all round with long spidery limbs and long whippy tail to balance. Dense black coat very well mingled in pale and mid red. A friendly lady excellently presented.

Ex 2nd – Armitage’s METEXA MARITZA (37k) F 31/01/10. A nice big girl of very good type and style. Good head type with oriental eyes of good green but showing a hint of a “look” today. Good warm tones to cinnamon coat, some light ghosting evident on her sides and extremities. Excellent to handle.

3rd – Cassar-Simmonds’ TOGHAR INFIDELITYS LEGACY (29) F 18/05/10. A stylish girl but her coat was not right today, it was rather dark and very unsound, she was also losing a lot of hair today. Easy to handle.

A.V. Oriental Limit Kitten

1st – Keoghan’s HEMLOCK TICKLED PINK (37fn) F 12/07/10. A little bit dainty for 7 months but very stylish and well balanced overall. Her coat colour was excellent, hot matte apricot with the bare minimum of tabby markings, coat length and texture also very good. A friendly girl.

2nd – Brown’s HEMLOCK TAROT DELAS BRUJAS (37) M 13/07/10. This really should have been my winner, a lovely boy for type and he was well developed for his age. He also has an excellent coat, glossy jet black and sound to roots with

lovely sleek texture. What a pity he has a visible fixed deviation to the end of the tail. Super to handle.

3rd – Hirst's TOGHAR RHYTHM N BLUES (37a) M 17/11/10. This lad is typy but a bit small and needs to be more substantial for his age and needs more coverage over the spine. Lovely soft blue tone to coat, quite heavily ghosted at present but sound, rather soft and slightly fluffy today. A sweet babe.

A.V. Oriental Breeders Neuter

1st – Webster's NANPEMA FLAMNECO (37d) MN 08/03/10. A handsome lad for type, strong head with broad top line and large ears. He is very well developed for his age with a long strong body. Super rich red colour to coat but very heavily spotted at present, hopefully this will improve as he matures. Excellent to handle

A.V. Oriental Not Bred by Exhibitor Neuter

1st – Woodfield's WESTGARTH MACKENZIE (37r) MN 16/04/10. A great big lad, extremely well developed for 10 months. Overall type good, head perhaps marginally longer than wide but the ears are of very good size and set. Good green eyes with oriental expression. Very long, “puppy” body at present, good tail. Coat colour a good warm fawn but very unsound today

2nd – Halliday's TOGHAR ONCE INA BLUE MOON (37a) MN 19/04/10. Good type to this boy albeit a touch dainty, head quite stylish perhaps marginally long in the muzzle. Eyes vivid green in colour and his coat was a good mid blue, with the best texture of the day, beautifully short and sleek. A sweet boy.

A.V. Siamese/Balinese Adult Male

1st – Hall's CH FURRYFACE BURLINGTON BERTIE (24) M 26/12/08. Overall a very well balanced lad of very good type, albeit a touch effeminate for a mature male. Balanced head with wide top and large ears set to balance. Eyes have good shape set and depth of colour but lack brilliance of tone. Warm seal points almost matching. Excellent to handle.

2nd – Brownrigg's CH CHAPELFIELD HOLY MOSES (32fn) M 25/06/09. An elegant lad of very good type. Longer wedge with very good top line and large ears set to follow. Oriental eye shape and set, colour could be deeper. Super points colour, coat shaded overall to tone but good length and texture. Excellently presented.

3rd – Gibbons' GD CH RICHDAL LONE RANGER (24) M 22/02/07. I have always liked the type and masculinity of this lad but he was not looking his best on this occasion. His points looked almost black and his coat was long and rather harsh in texture, it also had extensive “pepper & salt” shading today. A change of coat will do wonders hopefully. Easy to handle as always.

A.V. Siamese/Balinese Adult Female

1st – Brock's IMP GD CH KARAMUSHI TUTI FRUITY (32b1) F 04/08/07. I love the look of this lady she has that true Siamese expression. Lovely head for style and balance with super large ears set wide. A little bit “black & white” in appearance but there are some warmer red areas to her mingling. Coat excellent to today, short and sleek, albeit rather heavily shaded. Excellent to handle.

2nd – Gray & Johnson’s CH TOGHAR MAID TOORDER (32/1) F 12/10/08. A most attractive tabby point lady of very good type and with beautiful eyes, they have lovely shape set and expression and the deepest sapphire blue. Tabby pattern good with many tail rings. Very sweet tempered.

3rd – Pounds’ GD CH JOMESE JENNY MANYDOTS (32b1) F 03/08/07. A lovely girl but a touch lightweight today I thought. Very good head type, eyes could ideally be a deeper blue for a seal tortie. She has very good coat contrast for a seal tortie of this age. Excellent to handle.

A.V. Siamese/Balinese Kitten Male

1st – Hall’s FURRYFACE MARIO LS (24) M 27/08/10. I last saw this boy in December and he looked very promising then. He is beginning to fulfil that promise. Love his jug handled ears, they are really huge, a bit low set at present but he is a kitten and hopefully will grow into them. He can hold his eyes a touch full at times and the colour lacks a little brilliance. Points colour promising for warmth of tone. Presented to perfection.

A.V. Siamese/Balinese Breeders Kitten Female

1st – Hall’s FURRYFACE SACAJAWEA (32/1) F 24/08/10. A promising Tabby point baby with a lovely firm feel to her. Typy head with very large ears, eyes a touch wide at times and the colour could be deeper. Super whip tail.

2nd – Gillen’s OWAISA HIGH SOCIETY (24) F 10/10/10. A well grown girl of acceptable type. Quite good head with ear placement correct but they do need to be larger. Eyes have good shape and set but need a good deal more depth of blue. Points very dark seal and lacking warmth of tone, coat tending to white rather than cream with cool toned shading. An endearing kitten very well presented.

3rd – Rathbone’s BELLIS TAWNY (24) F 23/09/10. Fair type only to this lass and a little on the small side. Head narrow for balance and the ears are set much too close. Very good eye shape and set but the colour is very pale and she squints quite badly in both eyes. Very good points colour with a lovely warm tone. Correct coat colour too, a warm almost un-shaded cream. Sweet kitten to handle.

Kitten number 459 I refused to judge. She was so underweight I asked the duty vet to withdraw her. It was a great shame, as this was a really lovely kitten for both type and colour and would have easily won this class. She also had the sweetest temperament which some how made the whole thing worse.

A.V. Siamese/Balinese No Bred by Exhibitor Kitten Male

1st - Ellis’ MAFDET TUXEDO (24) M 06/09/10. A very promising little boy, lovely head type but can top his very large ears from time to time. Very good eye colour and expression. Dense seal points with some warmth of tone. Fabulous tail, very long and like a piece of string! Excellent to handle

A.V. Siamese/Balinese No Bred by Exhibitor Kitten Female

1st – Brooks’ MAFDET RAINBOW (32b8) F 29/06/10. A very stylish kitten with excellent head type. Top of head excellent with large butterfly ears set wide. Super

shape set and expression to eyes with lovely intensity of colour. Points show good apricot tones. A little shy but handled well.

A.C. Siamese Junior (32series and Balinese equivalent) Neuter

1st – Prescott’s MOEI COLOUROF MAGIC (32a) MN 16/04/10. A very handsome and stylish person with very good maturity for age. Excellent head type with very well set ears. Super eyes for shape set and colour, looked fabulous against his very good red points. A very relaxed boy who handled really well.

2nd – Marshall’s NANPEMA CERYS-CARIAD (32b1) F 08/03/10. A good sized girl of very good type and her coat texture was excellent. Unfortunately her eye colour is a good deal paler than ideal. Easy to handle.

A.C. Siamese/Balinese Senior Neuter

1st – Bennett’s CH & PR DAZZLING SWEETALKING GUY (32/8) MN 21/02/07. One of my favourite neuters, I love his type, his strength of head and overall balance. Points colour good and his tabby markings are excellent, with really well ringed tail. A joy to handle.

2nd – Pounds’ GD CH & PR JOMESE JENUINELY GORJUS (32a) FN 04/05/06. A beautiful lady neuter ran the winner close, she has such a superior look . Very well balanced medium wedge with excellent top of head and large open based ears set to balance. Lovely expression to eyes of very good colour. Good bright red points, minimally shaded coat of very good length and texture. Beautifully presented.

3rd – Turvey’s PR STYPERSON BIJOU (24b) MN 07/08/06. This lad is very stylish especially when he poses, it is just a pity he is such a dark chocolate, but having said that there is a hint of warmth in places.. Nice eyes for shape set and expression. A dear boy who always handles well.

Leo, AV Siamese/Balinese/Oriental Cat Kitten or Neuter born July 22nd – Aug 21st.

1st – Turvey’s PR STYPERSON MYSTIQUE (24n) MN 07/08/06. Not sure what the criteria for judging this class is, but as he was the only one I don’t suppose it matters. A large neuter of good type. Slightly heavy medium wedge with good top and proportionate ears well set . Oval eyes that need to be deeper in colour. Points colour looked good today with the desired brownish tones clearly evident. He let me know I was not his favourite person, but handled okay.
