BREED CLASSES

Siamese/Balinese Grand Premier Male

IMP - Meekings’ UK GD CH & GD PR LEMENTAL RED ALERT (61dt) MN 14/06/03. A dear old friend, a Balinese with true Siamese type and the correct long silky frilly bits required. I have judged him so many times there is little to add, he looked very good today and his coat was excellent. A wonderful ambassador for the breed and at over 8 years old, he can still give the youngsters a run for their money. Handled well today, excellently presented.

R – Sibley’s GD PR ATARIQ FIORI (24c) MN 25/01/09. A large handsome lad of very good type and style. Medium length wedge with very good top of head, ears just about large enough to balance and set very well. Oriental eye shape and set with good expression and deep blue colour. Marginal dip to broad nose, firm chin and level bite. Long really weighty and substantial body whilst still retaining elegance, tail needs an inch to balance. Points colouring appeared to be on the dark side and could be pinkier in tone, but were not helped by the yellow lighting. Pale magnolia coat with excellent contrast, just the lightest of shading to tone. Length very good and texture lovely today. Excellent to handle and immaculately presented

Siamese/Balinese Grand Premier Female

IMP – Meekings’ IMP GD CH & GD PR FIROUSI FREESPIRIT (32c) FN 26/03/03. Another old friend turned out to perfection. Beautiful for type with such a serene expression and the most perfect pale cream points colour, rarely if ever seen in a Siamese other than her. She does have a slightly long and rather thick coat but that would appear to be common in older neutered ladies, and it is impressively almost clear of shading. In a very good mood today.

Lilac Point Siamese Male Neuter

1st PC w/h – Redworth’s FLUTTERBY THE ALCHEMIST (24c) MN 29/09/10. A lovely boy for type and style but somewhat effeminate looking at present, Well balanced head with very good top line and large flared ears wide set. Oriental eye shape and set, colour mid blue with a tendency to squint at times. Almost straight profile and good chin, bite very untidy, sore looking and overshot. Surprisingly weighty body for such a slender boy, long limbs and tail to balance. Pale pinky points with a good amount of colour on the front limbs given the paleness of tone. Virtually un-shaded magnolia coat of close texture. A shame about the bite and squint. The sweetest temperament and excellently presented.

Blue Point Siamese Adult Female

CC & BOB – Simpson’s SHERMESE MASQUERADE (24a) F A stylish and overall well balanced lady, albeit a touch dainty for an adult. Medium wedge with very good top of head and large flared ears very well set. Oriental eye shape and set with good expression and mid blue colour. Almost straight profile with firm-ish chin, bite marginally over. Long slender and dainty body but well toned with good weight for size, has one two small fatty lumps under tummy, long whip tail to balance. Mid blue points fairly well matched, medium shading to coat that showed a little glacial tone to bib and tummy, coat length and overall texture good and close lying. Easy to handle and excellently presented. I understand this makes her a Champion today, many congratulations.

Caramel Point Siamese Adult

CC – Burrows’ KAYPEZ STARRY EYED (24n) F 08/11/10. A young female of stylish type, only just adult and looking it. Medium length wedge with wide top line, and very large wide at base ears, setting okay but with a tendency to bonnet at times. Oriental eye shape and set with inscrutable expression and mid blue colour. Strong profile with broad nose, good chin and bite. Firm and weighty little body of good length, long slender limbs and long tail to balance. Points more dark lilac at present, but it is early days for points colour development, and there is a hint of brown at the base of the ears and on the tail, coat also the correct colour a virtually unshaded, cool toned off-white. Not entirely happy but handled well. Excellently presented.

BOB - Withers’ GD CH TITALLY TICKERTY BOO (24n) F 15/05/10. (See CP report).

Simpson’s CH FLUTTERBY ROCK STEADY EDDY (24n) M 29/03/10. A stylish male but still has some maturing to do. Well balanced medium wedge with very good top of head and large flared ears very well set. Oriental eye shape and set with mid blue colour. Good profile and chin with level bite. Well toned body of good length with good tail to balance. Lilac-based caramel points could show more brownish tone but he is still young. Almost clear coat of very good length and texture Sweet tempered and easy to handle, excellently presented.

Morgan’s GD CH ASTRALBLAESE ANDROMEDA (24n) 21/11/04. A neat older lady of good overall type. Head quite stylish with good top and large ears very well set. Eye shape and set good but colour needs to be a good deal deeper. Good profile and chin, bite very untidy and lacks top incisors. Long well toned body, long limbs, tail almost balances. Her points colouring remains ambiguous and lacks the dark sludgy tones you would expect in a cat of her age, however the coat is the correct cool toned off white. Her lack of shading was impressive at 6yrs of age and her coat length and texture was very good. A little shy but very gentle. Excellently presented.

Tortie Point Siamese Kitten

1st & BOB – SHERMESE SUMMERLOVIN (32b1) F1/05/11. A gorgeous little baby, very promising. Strong little head with excellent top and large butterfly ears wide set. Oriental eye shape and set with a really inscrutable expression for a baby and super deep sapphire colour. Strong profile and deep chin with level bite. Dainty but firm body of promising length, long fine limbs and whippy tail to balance. Very dark seal tortie points, well mingled but in mainly very pale red, there were two patches on her toes and a smidge on the muzzle that could have been mistaken for white rather than pale red, but in the available lighting I could not be completely sure so gave her the benefit of the doubt. No doubt it will become clearer whether it really is white as she grows. Good close texture to coat. A dear babe, beautifully presented.

BREED CLASSES

Siamese/Balinese/Pointed Bicolour Imperial Grand Premier

OGP – Janicki's IMP GD PR SHERMESE FABULOUS FARBERGE (24) MN 101/02/09. A beautifully stylish boy. I have remarked on previous occasions that he is quite dainty for a male, but now he seems to have filled out and matured. Longish stylish wedge with very good top of head and large beautifully set ears. Gorgeous eyes for shape and set, depth and brilliance of colour. Strong straight profile, with firm chin and level bite. Long elegant neck and long slender but weighty and firm toned body, long whip to balance. Dense warm toned seal points, medium seal shading to coat thus good contrast still seen, coat length and texture very good. Rather shy but responded well to some persuasion and eventually came out of his shell. Excellently presented.

R – Smout's IMP GD PR KAMIK FIRECRACKA (32a) MN 18/07/08. Another gorgeous boy who ran the winner very close indeed. I was surprised to see who he was, he is another lad who seems to have developed some size and substance. Lovely head balance, medium wedge with wide top and large wide based ears set to perfection. Excellent expression to oriental eyes of good blue colour. Profile a little uneven, with flat area above the brow line and a dip to nose, chin firm, bite untidy with some incisors missing but appeared level, lots of freckles to nose leather. Long

lithe but surprisingly weighty body, long elegant limbs with long tapered tail to balance. Bright red points colour, warm white coat with the minimum of pale red shading, length and texture really good. A friendly boy, excellently presented.

Siamese/Balinese Grand Champion Male

IMP – Withers' GD CH TITALLY TIME-LORD (24n) M 09/05/10. Such a strong, handsome and masculine boy. Lovely head type and strength, wide top line and very large ears set to balance. Oriental eye shape and set with noble expression, depth of colour very good. Straight strong profile, chin could be better but bite level. Long strong and very well muscled body, long limbs and tail that just about balances. Dark lilac-based caramel points, to nit pick they could be a little more brown in tone but they are perfectly acceptable. Off-white coat, lightly shaded to tone, with short sleek and close lying texture. Perfect to handle and immaculately presented.

Siamese/Balinese Grand Champion Female

IMP – Cook's GH CH JOHPAS MIZMIXTURE (32b2) F 14/07/10. I ran out of superlatives about this beautifully lady a long time ago, for me she is almost perfection. When I say almost, it is because you really do have to hunt for the required break on the right hind limb, and although her profile is really strong, it is not exactly straight, but these things are very minor when taken in the context of the whole cat, who as usual takes my breath away. Many congratulations on the overall BIS win in both shows.

R – Withers' GD CH TITALLY TICKERTY BOO (24n) F 15/05/10. Unlucky again this lovely lady with the perfect caramel points colouring, and thus my preference over her brother for BOB in the other show. Overall she is a very even and well balanced lady with the head an almost perfect inverted triangle, with the ears excellently set. Eyes excellent for shape set expression and depth of colour. Strong profile and chin with level bite. Body long and slender but with excellent substance and tone, long limbs, but tail needs an inch to balance. Very dark, sludgy toned lilac-based caramel points with excellent contrast to almost clear off-white coat, with beautifully sleek texture. Lovely to handle as always, and presented to perfection.

Pointed Oriental Bicolour Grand Premier

1st IMP w/h, Meekings' GD PR RANTIPOLE REMEMBRANCE (48 40b) MN 23/03/09. A lovely boy, he is overall very stylish and well balanced, and if he had been a little bigger and more masculine, I would have been happy to give him the certificate. He has some excellent qualities apart from his type, he has well over the one third white required and his chocolate points are remarkably warm in tone for a bicour, he also has really good, brilliant eye colour given the proximity of white on the mask. A little shy today but handled well, in top condition and excellently presented.

Seal Point Male Kitten

1st & BOB – Blake's SPIRITWIND CAPTAIN KREMIN (24) M 26/02/11. A fairly well grown boy of overall good type. Medium length wedge, top line a touch narrow, ears of good size but set just that bit close for balance. Oriental eye shape and set with mid blue colour. Straight profile, chin okay, bite scissored over. Well covered and firm toned body of good length, neat limbs and paws, whip tail almost

balances. Dark dense seal points, with warm toned creamy coat, minimally shaded to tone, with soft fine baby texture as yet. A friendly boy excellently presented.

Seal Point Female Kitten

2nd , 1st w/h – Williams’ MYFINA CASSIOPA OPERA (24) F 05/05/11. The sweetest little person and very well grown for her age, but only fair for type and she had several problems that precluded the awarding of the first prize today. Medium length wedge with narrow top of head, ears of good size but set too close together. Oriental eye shape and set, but colour far too pale for a seal and she was squinting badly today. Profile not correct and almost retruse, chin good and bite level, teething pinch to muzzle. Firm weighty and well developed little body of good length, long tail to balance. Fairly warm seal points but they were very patchy and she had extensive brindling on the mask. Pale beige coat with lovely texture for a baby. Excellently presented.

Red Point Male Neuter

BOB - Smout’s IMP GD PR KAMIK FIRECRACKA (32a) MN 18/07/08

Also considered for BOB – Cook’s PR TIANLEX PRETTY FLAMINGO (32a) F 05/09/10. This lady has a beautiful head from the front view, medium in length with lovely wide top and large wide based ears set to balance. The side view is not quite so good as she shows quite a prominent bump near the end of her nose, but chin and bite good. Lovely tone to her long body and she has a very good tail. Paler but bright red points, contrasting beautifully with her almost unshaded coat of excellent close texture. Beautifully poised and presented.

Tortie Point Siamese Adult

BOB - Cook’s GH CH JOHPAS MIZMIXTURE (32b2) F 14/07/10

Also considered for BOB – Kincaide’s CH LAZIZA DAISY POPPETTS (32b1) F 15/06/10. Unlucky to meet the BOB winner today. Strong and stylish head with very good top line and large ears set to balance, to nit pick she could be marginally finer in the muzzle but it does not detract. Excellent eye shape set and expression, colour good. Long weighty body with tail to almost balance. Very dark seal points with generally very pale red mingling, which does tend to give an overall impression of black & white rather than seal & red, and she is quite heavily shaded for a youngster. However, coat length and texture excellent. Easy to handle and excellently presented.

Apricot Point Siamese Male Kitten

1st & BOB – Bunyan’s LAZIZA TEPPENYAKI (32fn) M 18/12/10. Beautifully developed this strong and stylish kitten. Very good head with excellent top line and large ears set wide. Wonderful profile with an unbroken, gently curving line almost from the back of the skull to the tip of his nice “fat” nose, good deep chin that lines up with the nose tip and a level bite. Well developed and substantial body for a kitten, long strong limbs and quite large paws, well tapered tail needs an inch to balance. Points colouring very promising with good hot tones to base of ears and tail, off-white coat that was almost clear of shading and good close texture. Lovely temperament, a very laid back and relaxed lad. Excellently presented.

Apricot Point Siamese Female Kitten

1st – Reed's JOHPAS JESSIE JAY (32fn) F 23/04/11. A promising baby. Lovely little head with super top and large butterfly ears set wide. Basic eye shape good albeit held a little wide today colour could be marginally deeper but was acceptable. Baby growth dips to profile as yet, good chin and level bite, teething pinch to muzzle. Dainty but firm toned body, long fine limbs, whippy tail to balance. Promising points colour, with warmth of tone to ears & tail, un-shaded coat of soft fine baby texture. A very confident and posed young Miss. Beautifully presented.

Apricot Point Siamese Neuter

BOB – Crowley's GD PR JOHPAS KITTY GALORE (32fn) FN 27/06/10. A dainty lady neuter of very good type. Well balanced medium wedge with good top and large ears very well set. Mid blue eyes of good shape and set, haws up a touch today. Almost straight profile with firm chin and level bite. Long and surprisingly substantial body with long limbs and good whip tail. Fabulous points colouring, absolutely no doubt over her colour, with the hot matte tones required. Good contrast to off-white coat that was minimally shaded to tone, length and texture excellent – it was short and very sleek. An easy girl to handle, excellently presented.

Balinese Neuter

BOB - Meekings' UK GD CH & GD PR LEMENTAL RED ALERT (61dt) MN 14/06/03 (See LP report)

Also considered for BOB – Meekings' CH & PR LEMENTAL PANDORA (61t) FN01/06/01. It is amazing that this neuter lady is 10 years old! Strong medium wedge with very good top of head and good sized ears for this breed, that were nicely fluffed and furnished. Good shape and set to eyes, the colour has faded out a touch from what I remember when she was young, but it is still very good. Tiny dip to nose, deep strong chin, no teeth. Good weight and substance to body, she has lost a little muscle tone but that is only to be expected at this age, tail needs length to balance. Lovely clear seal tabby markings with good tail rings, shading to body shows a very nice spotted pattern, although it appears to have become less distinct than it was. Coat length the best I have seen on her, texture a touch dry over the lower back. Excellent temperament and presentation.
