Cathy Baxter was my steward and companion for the day, as usual she handled the cats beautifully and made my job an easy one, many thanks Cathy.

OPEN CLASSES

Red Point Male Kitten

1st & BOB – Bowles-Gowdy's MAFDET DARE DEVIL (32a) M 29/06/10. A very promising little boy, not the biggest for his age but nice and solid. Super head with lovely top and large open based and well flared ears excellently set. Oriental eye shape set and expression with excellent deep, brilliant toned blue colour. Tiny baby growth dips to profile as yet, firm chin and level bite, teething pinch to muzzle with second canines beginning to show through. Solid and weighty little body, dainty limbs and paws with super long whippy tail to balance. Good bright red points colour developing. Warm white, medium length coat, with minimum shading and super close texture for a baby. Excellent temperament, a friendly babe, excellently presented.

2nd – Tooth's TIANLEX REDBULL CHASER (32a) M 13/07/10. This stylish lad was actually bigger and better developed than the winner, but one or two small things put him down to 2nd today. Strong little head with really wide top line and very large bat-like ears. Good shape and set to eyes but colour needs to be deeper and lacks brilliance of tone, he also has a slight “look” at present. Baby dips to profile, chin good and bite level, second canines erupting. Firm body and long limbs, tail needs a little more length to balance. Bright mid red points developing. Long soft kitten coat at present, un-shaded. A very sweet baby, excellently presented.

Red Point Female Kitten

1st – Paul's ROZANDEN AEMILIA (32a) F 07/04/10. A nicely grown girl of good type. Longer wedge with marginally narrow top line and ears of good size set to follow the lines of the wedge. Almost straight profile, chin a touch shallow and bite scissored over at present. Long weighty and well covered body, long fine limbs, tail needs a little more length to balance. Paler but fairly bright red points. Coat of medium length which still has soft fine baby texture, minimally shaded to tone. Excellent temperament and presentation.

Balinese Male Neuter

PC Woodhouse's PR DORAL LE BRUIN (61ft) MN 12/10/10. A lovely big Bali neuter boy of very good type and style. Strongish medium wedge with very good top of head and good sized ears for this breed, set to balance. Oriental eye shape and set with good depth of colour that could be a touch more brilliant in tone. Straight profile and good firm chin, bite untidy with several lower incisors missing, appears level-ish. Weighty body of good length with strong limbs and largish well tufted paws, tail to almost balance. Excellent hot toned apricot colour to tabby markings, showing good scarab, single cheek ribbons, but typically no thumb prints, bracelets pale, tail rings seen on the last third of the plume when shaken out. Excellent silky

texture to coat which lies well, it could ideally be a touch longer down the sides, but plume well furnished. Excellent to handle and beautifully presented.

2nd – White's OCEANBREZE INDIANA JONES (61fnt) MN 04/10/09. An attractive lad, the elder of these two lads but the less mature looking. Medium length wedge with good top of head and proportionately sized ears set to follow. Oriental eye shape and set with deep blue colour. Slightly uneven profile with dip to nose, good-ish chin and level bite. Long body, really substantial, perhaps a little too much so as it tends to make his head look slightly small in proportion. Very good apricot tabby markings with an almost muddy tone to them. Scarab good with single cheek ribbons, tail rings very evident. Coat length good, lies close to body with texture very fine and silky, but plume could be a little better furnished. Lovely temperament, and excellently presented.

Judged for BOB and awarded – Meekings' UK GD CH & GD PR LEMENTAL RED ALERT (61dt) MN 14/06/03. I have long been an admirer of this lad who despite his more senior years continues to look the part as it were. Strong and stylish for type with excellent well balanced head and well furnished ears of good size. Oriental eye shape and set with mid blue colour. Profile rather uneven these days with dip to brow line, really deep strong chin, bite lacks incisors but looks level. Excellent weight and substance to long body, long strong limbs and large paws, tail need a little more length to balance. Rich red tabby markings with very obvious tail rings. Very good length to coat, flowing beautifully with super silky texture, some light shading to tone. Very good temperament, - not a single protest from him today. Excellently presented.

MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES.

A.C. Debutante Adult

3 super ladies it was very close between them.

1st – Pounds' JOMESE JENNI LOTSASPOTS (32b1) F 29/01/10. This lady has gained some size since we last met I am pleased to say. Lovely head type with broad top and very large butterfly ears set well apart. Eye shape typical albeit marginally large, setting good, colour has good depth but lacks brilliance. Points well mingled in mainly paler red. Coat heavily shaded for a youngster. Beautifully posed and presented.

2nd – Ellams' JAKURTZI KARAMELMYST (24n) F 12/12/09. A very stylish gir, well developed for age. Lovely eyes of very good shape set and colour. Excellent points colouring showing super brownish tones already. Un-shaded coat of excellent length and texture. Lovely to handle.

3rd – Simpson's SHERMESE MASQUERADE (24a) F 09/12/09. A very feminine lady with such an even and well balanced head. Eye shape set & expression excellent with brilliant colour. Long weighty body that tends to make her head look marginally small in proportion. Points a touch on the dark side with some slight muddiness of tone in places. Super to handle.

Breed 24 Siamese Kitten not bred by Exhibitor

1st – English's MAPU JUDE (24c) M 22/05/10. A promising boy for type and well grown. Super little head with very good top and large flared ears set wide. Very good

eye shape set and expression with excellent depth of colour. Points colour somewhat ambiguous at present, it is rather dark and the ears lack pinkish tone, but not clearly caramel either so I suspect he will have to be watched to see how he develops. Excellent temperament

A.C. Debutante Kitten

An excellent class with all the kittens present of a high quality.

1st – Reed’s JOHPAS MIZMIXTURE (32b2) F 14/07/10. Simply fabulous, I could not stop myself going back to look at this baby throughout the day, she brings me out in goose bumps she is so gorgeous. Lovely little head with ears beautifully set, I look forward to seeing how she develops. Just the one thing, I really do think she will end up caramel rather than blue unless she clears the baby muddy tones that she has, the mingling is quite warm too. Almost perfect and she doesn’t she know it!

2nd – Withers’ TINTALLY TICKERTY BOO (24n) F 15/05/10. This kitten was also very lovely and her lilac-based caramel points colour was excellent for her age, with clear brownish tones to ears and tail. Very good shape and set to eyes, perhaps marginally large but of super colour. Lovely short coat for a kitten. Excellent to handle.

ex 2nd – Richards’ DEBIKAT OOHLALAGAGA (24) F 23/06/10. A promising baby for type with very good head and large flared ears excellently set. Super expression to eyes of good colour. Excellent warm seal points colouring developing – good to see, with warm creamy coat of very good texture. A sweet babe.

3rd – Woodhouse’s DORAL MARMADUKE (61fnt) M 17/06/10. A well grown Bali baby of promising type. Good head with largish ears. Good eye shape set and colour, with inscrutable expression. Tabby markings a really warm apricot with clear un-shaded coat of very good length for a baby. Love his ears fluffs. A friendly boy.

A.C. Pointed Bicolour Breeders Neuter

1st - Meekings’ RANTIPOLE REMEMBRANCE (48 40b) MN 23/03/09. This lad has lovely type and overall balance, I would just like him a little bigger and more masculine. His chocolate points have an excellent warm tone for a Bicolour and his eye colour is good given the proximity of white, which is just over the one third required and in all the correct places. This can be seen quite clearly now that he has matured. Excellent to handle.

A.C. Pointed Bicolour Non Breeders Neuter

1st Whiston’s LEBRETON CHEYENNE PLAINS (48 40) MN 06/07/06. This boy on the other hand does not have enough white, which is a great pity because his type, style and maturity is excellent. He does have white in all the right places and if the line down his tummy was wider he would get away with it. Excellent to handle and presented to perfection.

NON-PEDIGREE OPEN CLASSES

Non-Pedigree Pets.

Ginger or any colour Tortie SH cat with or without White

MCC - Maison’s GARFIE (Ginger) MN 3yrs. This boy has a wonderful temperament, he purred like a tractor throughout and insisted on showing me his not

inconsiderable tummy. Vivid green eyes and rich coppery red coat that was in lovely condition and prepared to perfection.

2nd – Mitchell’s REGGIE (Ginger Tabby) MN 1yr 5 mths. Handsome chap, not unfriendly but not quite as outgoing as the winner. He has a lovely soft well groomed coat in mid red and pretty green eyes to contrast.

Judged for BOV only and awarded - White’s MC NERO (Ginger Tabby) MN 4yrs. A absolutely gorgeous boy, really huge and substantial – it was just as well he preferred to stand on my trolley! And he has the most enormous pudgy feet. Lovely plushy coat with rich red spotting, clear green oval eyes so sweet expression. Obviously loves his shows – purred for England

Pedigree Pets

A.C. Shorthair Kitten

1st & BOV – Jackson’s RAYNE (Black Silver Spotted) F 15 wks. Pretty baby with such a sweet expression to her hazel eyes. In lovely condition she has soft fine coat with attractive black spotting on silver ground. Slightly cross but easy to handle.

A.C. Shorthair Kitten

1st – Jakeman’s LEXUS (Chocolate Tabby Point) M 5 mths. A dear little Siamese type baby with warm toned chocolate tabby points showing an excellent pattern with lots of tail rings. Expressive eyes of pale blue. Wonderful coat texture, really short and close lying. Very friendly.

MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES.

A.C. Shorthair Kitten

1st - White’s INDIA (Tortoiseshell) F 8 mths. Gorgeous older baby, so friendly and playful. Lovely dense black mingled overall in rich red tortie, shown in immaculate condition. Has a huge purr for a kitten.

2nd - Jackson’s RAYNE (Black Silver Spotted) F 15 wks.

3rd - Jakeman’s LEXUS (Chocolate Tabby Point) M 5 mths.

A.C. Visitors Adult

1st – Miller’s GMC CLEO KATRA MILLER (Blue & White Tortie) FN 09/03/05. Super Sphynx lady neuter, virtually bald with heat coming off her body in waves, she would make a wonderful hot water bottle. Love her prehensile tail. She has the most perfect temperament. Some one was telling me her history, which was absolutely horrifying, so it is even more amazing that she is so sweet tempered.

2nd - Maison’s GARFIE (Ginger) MN 3yrs

ex 2nd – Jones’ MC TEJAS (Blue Spotted Tabby & White) MN 25/03/09. A very dignified looking boy, he does pose so well in his pen. I still think he is a blue silver spotty, not that it matters. Immaculately presented and so easy to handle.

3rd – Passfield-Taylor’s IGMC MISTY (Tortie & White) FN 3yrs. Beautiful tortie & White lady, not unfriendly but she swished her tail to let us know it was as a limited interview as she had better things to do, like eating her lunch. Perfectly prepared.

ex 3rd – Passfield-Taylor’s GMC PIXI (Tabby & White) FN 4yrs. A lovely tabby & white lady with pristine white areas and well defined tabby pattern, eyes a vivid green colour. Somewhat aloof in expression she actually handled very well. Also perfectly prepared.

Visitors Kitten

1st - White’s INDIA (Tortoiseshell) F 8 mths

2nd - Brock’s NUTMEG (Golden Tabby) FN 8 mths. So attractive for overall colouring which contrasts beautifully with her eyes. Super coat, beautifully groomed with lovely texture. Excellent temperament and immaculately presented.

3rd - Jackson’s RAYNE (Black Silver Spotted) F 15 wks.

A.C. Rescue Adult/Kitten Female

1st - Miller’s GMC CLEO KATRA MILLER (Blue & White Tortie) FN 09/03/05

2nd – Hutchinson’s GMC PAPAGENA (Tortie Tabby) FN April 2008. Rather cross but lovely to look at with very nice balance between the two pattern elements, - clearly pencilled tabby tracings and lots of orange with a particularly large splotch on the head. Excellently prepared and presented.
