OPEN CLASSES

Oriental Grand Champion Female

IMP – Hirst's GD CH TOGHAR PASTICHE (37h) F 16/07/07. A most attractive lady of very good type. Medium length wedge, top line perhaps marginally narrow for perfect balance, better when she relaxes, ears large and flared, set on correctly. Almond shaped eyes of good vivid green colour. Almost straight profile, good firm chin and level bite. Elegant neck-line and long very slender but firm toned body with long slender limbs and neat oval paws, whip tail almost balances. Super coat qualities, the chocolate colour is quite dark, but really warm in tone, and combined with the rich red tortie mingling the overall effect is excellent, it is also very sound, with short close-lying texture. Excellent to handle, beautifully poised and presented on a blanket throne.

2nd R w/h – Vigger's GD CH SANDTUM SUGAR N SPICE (37k) F 17/03/05. A dear lady of overall good type and style. Medium wedge with slightly narrow top, ears of good size and base width but set a mite close for balance. Oval shape to eyes with a tendency to hold full, colour yellowish green. Slight dip to profile, good chin and bite, muzzle could be a little finer. Very good length and excellent substance to body with fine limbs and neat oval paws, tail well tapered and almost balances. Rich warm toned cinnamon coat but unfortunately very unsound today with a good deal of ghost spotting evident on the body, length and texture very good. Rather wriggly but not unfriendly. Excellently presented.

Oriental Tortoiseshell Adult

Judged for BOB only and awarded - Hirst's GD CH TOGHAR PASTICHE (37h) F 16/07/07.

Oriental Fawn Adult

CC & BOB – Roper's SNOWSEAL SUNNYDELIGHT (37r) F 09/09/09. A neat little queen of very good type, not the largest of girls and slightly immature but acceptable for just on the year old. Neat and even medium wedge with good top and large flared ears set to follow. Oriental eye shape and set with sweet expression, colour yellowish green. Good profile and chin with level bite. Dainty but well covered body of medium length, long fine limbs and small oval paws, tail rather short for balance. Super coat, soft rosy fawn, it is a touch unsound on the lower sides and there is some light ghosting to the body but for this colour it was not too bad at all, length good and texture excellent. Lovely temperament and excellently presented.

Oriental Black Neuter

PC & BOB – Ludwig’s WILLHAVETODO VOODOO MAJIC (37) MN22/08/09.

Such a naughty person, but oh so stylish and handsome. Strong head of medium length with excellent top and very large wide based ears set to balance. Really wicked expression to oriental eyes of pale green. Love his fat nose that was almost straight, good chin, surprisingly the bite is scissored over. Long really weighty body with long strong limbs, whip tail needs just a touch more length to balance out that long body. Dense, glossy black, boot polish coat, perhaps a touch long but very sleek for texture. Very cross as usual, beautifully presented.

Oriental Smoke Neuter

1st PC & BOB w/h – Stanbridge’s GD PR GENTANTIQUE AVALON (42k) MN

18/12/06. This boy is quite untypical in type for an Oriental. He has a heavy rounded wedge with narrow top line, his ears need to be larger and wider at the base and they are set upright. Eyes rather full in shape, possibly made fuller by him being so cross, colour hazel green. Dip to profile centre nose, good chin and level bite. Comfortably covered body of medium length, good length limbs, tail almost balances. Good warm cinnamon colour to coat, particularly considering that he is a smoke, unfortunately, it was very uneven in tone and interspersed with many ticked hairs today, silver undercoat barely up to the one third required on the sides, better over the back, length and texture very good. Not the happiest of bunnies, presentation excellent.

Oriental Longhair Neuter

Judged for BOB only and awarded – Whitby’s GD PR PIPPASRO MAGIK

FLUTE (62 43fn) MN 07/07/07. A lovely boy for type and he does know just how to show himself. Super head for style and overall balance with excellent top and large, well furnished and fluted ears excellently set. Oriental eye shape and set with marginal “look” today, colour pale green. Good profile and deep chin with level bite. Long weighty body with slender limbs and neat paws for this breed, the latter nicely fluffed, tail length good. Good rich apricot tones to coat, although his head is still little lighter in tone than the rest of him. Shaded pattern not the best, it is quite heavy, but it has lifted quite a bit and does lack definition, so happy to accept him as such. Overall his coat length is very good indeed, lying close to the body and frilling at the edges with quite profuse knickerbockers and very well furnished tail, texture beautifully fine and silky. Perfect to handle and excellently presented.

A.C. Siamese/Balinese Champion Male

GD CC – Hart’ CH S*A’FAMOSA WAHANASSATTA (61at) M 29/11/08.

A large masculine lad of very good type. Strong head with excellent top line and large well furnished ears, set to follow the lines of the medium length wedge. Oriental shape and set to eyes of very good colour and expression. Straight strong profile with firm chin that lines up and level bite. Well muscled body of good length with long strong paws and fairly large well tufted paws, tail length almost balances. Tabby markings a dark rather muddy toned blue, but lighting not that helpful. Coat length fairly good and lying well, with the texture and preparation very good today, he is quite heavily shaded but there is some evidence of over-grooming in the past which partly explains that. He is slightly tense but that is only to be expected from an entire male of this age and he did handle well. Excellently presented.

R – Brownrigg’s CH CHAPELROSE HOLY MOSES (32fn) M 25/06/09. A very stylish boy, but not quite the finish and maturity of the winner, thus the Reserve today. Longer wedge but with very good top of head, ears large and flared, very well set but with tendency to bonnet at times. Very oriental shaped eyes, perhaps a touch deep set, colour has good depth but lacks brilliance. Straight strong profile which does give him a very snooty look, chin slopes back a touch, bite level. Long elegant but well covered and firm toned body, long limbs, tapered tail needs at least an inch to balance. Excellent points colour, very well developed for a young cat, with tail in particular really hot and intense in tone. Medium length off white coat of good texture, heavily shaded for a youngster and showing a clear spotted pattern on his flanks. A little shy but not unfriendly. Excellently presented.

A.C. Siamese/Balinese Champion Female

GD CC – Stokes’ GD CH LITTLEFEAT TATTOO HEART (32b1) F 26/11/05. A lovely lady but in naughty mode today. Super head with excellent top line and large wide based ears set to balance. Oriental eye shape and set with wicked expression today, depth and brilliance of colour excellent. Straight profile and firm chin, bite missing several incisors but appeared level-ish. Long dainty body, long slender limbs and neat paws, tapered tail needs an inch to balance. Tortie points on the black side of seal, the mingling was mid and paler red with all points very well broken. Very good length a texture to coat that was shaded overall to tone, but fairly good contrast still seen. Apart from the rather blue language she handled well. Excellently presented.

R – Davies’ CH BETHANJO WALKINGONSUNSHINE (32fn) F 12/05/08. An attractive and stylish lady. Very good head with wide top line and large well flared ears set wide. Oriental eye shape and set, colour difficult to discern as the pupils were very enlarged, but they looked as though they could do with a little more depth. Straight profile, chin could be deeper, bite missing many incisors but looks level-ish. Long neck and body, the latter slender but firm toned, tail needs an inch to balance. Good points colour, slightly sludgy toned deep apricot with tail very hot indeed. Off white coat of medium length and good close texture, lightly shaded down the spine. Very sweet tempered and excellently presented.

Seal Point Siamese Kitten

1st BOB w/h – White’s LITTLEWILLOW BELLATRIX (24) F 10/02/10. Overall this was a stylish kitten. Head type good with super top and very large ears that she needs to grow into. Almond shaped eyes well set that she can hold a little wide at times, this actually does her no favours as the colour is rather pale and dull. Almost straight profile, good chin and bite. Very good substance to longish body but manubrium prominent, good tail. Seal points very dark but do show some warmth of tone. Pale creamy coat of soft fine kitten texture, virtually un-shaded. Excellent temperament and presentation.

Red Point Siamese Kitten.

1st & BOB – Ellis’ MAFDET DIPLOMAT (32a) M 03/02/10. Super kitten for type and style, beautifully grown and developed for age. Longish wedge with excellent top line and very large ears excellently set. Oriental eye shape and set with snooty expression, colour could ideally be deeper but was acceptable. Strong roman profile which gives his head strength, good firm chin and level bite. Excellent weight and

substance to long body, long strong limbs and spoon paws, tail needs a little more length and has a small irregularity at the tip that you can feel but not see. Bright red points, well developed. Lovely coat, beautifully sleek and close, un-shaded. Excellent temperament and presentation.

Tortie Point Siamese Neuter

PC & BOB – Crisp & Wareham’s FLUTTERBY SQUEEZE MESLOW (32b1) FN 14/04/09. An attractive lady neuter of very good type and style. Balanced medium length wedge with very good width between large flared ears. Oval shaped eyes of medium blue well set. Quite a pronounced dip to profile centre nose, chin lines up and bite is level. Well covered and fairly firm toned body of good length, neat limbs and paws, tail almost balances. Very dark seal tortie points well mingled with various shades of red, some lovely rich tones, on the ears in particular, evident, and very pale red areas on the muzzle. Very good length and texture to coat, lightly shaded overall to tone. Very sweet natured and excellently presented.

MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

A.C. Oriental Adult

1st – McDermid’s BARBECCO TARIA (37k) F 27/09/09. Quite a stylish lady with good head type now – (I seem to remember she was a little narrow as a kitten), profile not quite straight with dip to nose, and unfortunately her bite is overshot. Good warm colour cinnamon to coat but lots of ticking evident today – changing her coat perhaps?. Easy to handle.

A.C. Oriental Senior Adult

1st - Hirst’s GD CH TOGHAR PASTICHE (37h) F 16/07/07.

A.C. Oriental Non-Self Kitten

1st – Tasker’s LORICHA BUNDOOK BOY (62 43s) M 29/12/09. A very stylish boy, but I am not entirely convinced he is Shaded, there is some diffusion of the pattern but it is very black and dense at the moment, although he is very young yet and this could improve. His real problem at the moment is the extensive tarnishing that he exhibits, to his muzzle and limbs in particular, but he even has tarnishing down over his shoulders which is very unusual. I do hope this sorts itself out because he is a very nice boy and his coat is lovely. Excellent to handle.

A.C. Oriental Debutante Kitten

1st – Siviter’s ROCHEROS LADY GUNEVERE (37h) F 27/03/10. Quite a promising baby with good head type. Super colouring to coat, the chocolate is medium in tone on the head and marginally darker on the body, but the tortie mingling, which is plentiful, is really rich and bright, it is also very sound. Good length and texture for a baby. Super whip tail. A sweet babe.

2nd – Hirst’s TOGHAR HEAVENSENTME (29) F 18/05/10. A wee babe of good type but Havana coat very dark indeed, lacking warmth and not the rich chestnut desired by the SOP, it is also very unsound at the moment. Eye colour also not good more yellow than green. Coat baby soft and fine as yet. Super to handle.

A.C. Oriental Limit Kitten

1st – Horst's TOGHAR ZINFADEL (37k) M 18/05/10. A very promising little person, a really solid baby. Coat needs to sort itself out, at present it is uneven in colour – albeit warm in tone, with extensive ghosting to body. Eye colour pale hazel green. A dear babe.

A.C. Oriental Kitten (4 – 6 months)

1st - Tasker's LORICHA BUNDOOK BOY (62 43s) M 29/12/09

A.C. Oriental Maiden Neuter

1st – Saxon's TORREYLAIN DEIGO (48b) MN 09/06/09. A handsome lad for type, he is a dark chocolate but he is mainly sound. White areas sufficient for the SOP – just, they do show in all the right places but the white line down his tummy does need to be stroked flat to be complete, so arguably not quite correct. Super temperament.

2nd – Crowley & Lambert's FIROUSI DAISIE-MAE (48 40at) FN 21/11/07. A very sweet, slightly rotund person of good type. Her eyes are a little large but the colour is excellent, she really does need bigger ears but they are very well set. White in all the right places with a good amount underneath that gives her the one third required, shading quite heavy, tabby markings a good soft mid blue. Handled well, good to see she now seems to enjoys her shows.

A.C. Oriental Limit Neuter

1st – Brown's HEMLOCK VIVA LASVEGAS (37n) MN 11/05/06. A great big chap with a stylish head. Body of good length but rather too comfortably covered at present. Coat of a rather bluish toned lilac based caramel, a little open today and slightly fine in texture, it also felt a bit harsh over the lower spine. Eye shape good, colour yellowish in tone. A friendly boy.

A.C. Oriental Senior Neuter

1st - Whitby's GD PR PIPPASRO MAGIK FLUTE (62 43fn) MN 07/07/07

2nd – Baxter's SOLARUS ALL THAT JAZZ (37y) FN 23/01/08. An attractive lady for type and colouring. Head type good, eyes a touch full in shape but colour a good green. Coat colour a darker fawn with plentiful rich hot cream tortie mingling, sound to roots and super texture. Lovely to handle.

3rd - Stanbridge's GD PR GENTANTIQUE AVALON (42k) MN 18/12/06

Siamese or Balinese 24 Series Adult

1st – Gibbons' GD CH RICHDAL LONE RANGER (24) M 22/02/07. I was very pleased to see how well this lad had done today, for me he is the perfect warm seal colour with the most wonderful contrast to his very lightly shaded creamy coat. He can sometimes be a bit too lean but today he was well covered and his coat texture was not bad at all. I do like his type and style too. Handled really well as always.

2nd – Gillen's CH OWAISSA SPIRITOFTHMIST (24a) F 14/05/09. A lovely little female with a well balanced head, I had her in my Grand class today too, but for me she is just that bit immature-looking for that award yet. She looks very dainty but

is surprisingly weighty. Her points colour is very good, a soft mid blue with minimal fawning. Beautifully poised and easy to handle.

Siamese or Balinese Aristocrat Adult

1st – Matthews & Pugh’s LOLUJA MISS BEHAVE (32t1) F 23/06/08. This lady is very good for type and has well defined tabby pattern, however her tortie pattern is minimal. She was very angry when I got to her and it was almost impossible to examine her properly, but I think I could see some tortie on her tail and maybe faint mottling on the ears.

Siamese or Balinese Breeders Kitten

1st – Maybury’s SAMANDJON MYANGEL (24b) F 13/04/10. An attractive babe a little bit dark for a chocolate but the colour improved when she was out of the pen and it was relatively warm in tone. Sweet expression to eyes with good depth of colour. Ivory coat, clear of shading with good texture. Lovely to handle.

2nd – White’s LITTLEWILLOW BELLATRIX (24) F 10/02/10

Siamese or Balinese Kitten 6 – 9 months

1st – Ellis’ MAFDET DIPLOMAT (32a) M 03/02/10

2nd – Hamilton’s LITTLEFEAT LOLA (32b1) F 05/03/10. What a naughty baby. She has a stylish head with large flared ears set wide. Oriental shaped eyes that could perhaps be a touch deeper in colour. Points developing well showing good breaks. It was most amusing that such a small person could be so cross, and I really do hope she settles down before she is adult because she is very promising.

3rd – White’s LITTLEWILLOW BELLATRIX (24) F 10/02/10

Siamese or Balinese 32 Series Neuter

1st – Armstrong’s GD CH JOHPAS RED ROUE (32a) MN 19/10/07. Wonderful type to this neuter boy, he such a strong well balanced head with excellent ear flare and set. Rich red colour to points with only lightly shaded coat, it was just a touch long a fine today, made worse by him fluffing himself up. A truly beautiful boy.

2nd – Glaubitz’s GD PR LITTLEFEAT DISTANT THUNDER (32a) MN 25/09/09. A younger boy, he does not quite have the strength and maturity of the winner, but he is nevertheless very stylish. Longer wedge with very good top and large ears set to follow. Good bright red points colour, lightly shaded coat of superb texture, beautifully short and close. A lovely boy to handle.

Siamese or Balinese Visitors Neuter

1st – Armstrong’s GD CH JOHPAS RED ROUE (32a) MN 19/10/07

2nd – Crisp & Wareham’s FLUTTERBY SQUEEZE MESLOW (32b1) FN 14/04/09

3rd – Gourley & Ward’s GD PR DAZZLING BEN HUR (24) MN 15/09/05. An older quality boy. He has a very good head and the sweetest expression, to nit pick the

eye colour could be a little deeper. Points dark and dense with some warmth of tone evident. Coat length and texture good but very heavily shaded now. Super to handle.

ex 3rd – Meek’s PR JOMESE JUSTLOOK ATME (24b) MN 06/11/08.

Loyalty Class - A.V Male Kitten

1st – Tucker’s ROWGARNER BUFFALOWBILL (67 31ts) M 10/03/10.

Beautifully developed boy, super type and substance to him. Inverted triangular head, perhaps a touch full in the muzzle and which shows some tarnishing of the silver. Lovely large ears, wide at base and perfectly set with the most gorgeous furnishings and lynx-like tips to them. Good straight profile and strong chin. Typical expression to green eyes. Strong body, well developed for age, long plume tail. Super coat for length and texture, with ruff & knickerbockers beginning to show. Handled beautifully, a real showman, in top condition.

2nd – Tucker’s ELVENWEYR JETHRO (67 19) M 17/04/10. A younger lad not quite so well developed. Overall type fairly good although the head tends to be a bit short and his eyes are on the small side, his profile is also not quite straight but the chin and bite are very good. Coat kitten soft at present but length good for age, muted mid red in colour. An easy boy to handle.

3rd Chesterman’s MENARA BIT O CRUMPET (40 4) M 29/03/10. A well grown boy with very good substance and bone. Fairly good head shape but needs to broaden with ears which are a trifle large at present and set a little close. Profile nicely rounded but nose fractionally long, chin deep and strong with bite marginally under. Good eye shape, well rounded and open, colour a paler but bright blue. Strong weighty body a little rangy at present with short strong limbs and rounded paws, tail slightly long but well shaped with rounded tip. Coat a good length but kitten soft, lacks crispness and lies a little flat. Frosty grey points with some pinkish tones evident, nose leather and paws pads pinkish grey. Lovely temperament to this lad, handled really well.
