OPEN CLASSES

A.C. Siamese/Balinese Grand Premier Male

1st IMP GD PC w/h - Hutchings' GD PR WILLHAVETODO SIR PERCY (24n) MN 27/05/06. A great big chap of very good type. Long wedge, with good top of head and large ears set to follow. Oriental eye shape and set, colour could be a deeper. Strong profile but he is rather too long in the muzzle, firm chin, bite untidy but level. Very long body but carrying too much condition today and spoiling his elegance completely, long strong limbs and oval paws, tail rather short and could be better tapered. Excellent points colour, dingy-toned lilac-based caramel, well matched on all points. Off white coat of excellent sleek texture today, shading very heavy and he is beginning to lack contrast now. Rather cross today and had some very rude things to say. Excellently presented

A.C. Siamese/Balinese Grand Premier Female

1st IMP GD PC w/h - Godwin's CH & GD PR GENETTA BLUE HYACINTH (24a) FN 18/07/03. A dear lady with some very good qualities, but for me she lacks the type and style I look for in an Imperial winner. Medium length wedge, marginally narrow at the top for balance, ears size good, could be a touch wider at the base perhaps, set in line with the head. Lovely eyes for shape, set and brilliance of colour. Pronounced dip to profile, firm chin, clean and level bite with all teeth in situ. Good length body with a trim firm tummy line - good to see in a neuter lady of this age, fine limbs and neat paws, tapered tail almost balances. Cool toned mid blue points, almost matching with just the tail marginally darker. Coat shows good glacial tones, not often seen these days, shading to a minimum in correct cool blue, length and texture good. A lovely lady to handle, obviously enjoys her shows. Excellently presented.

Oriental Tortoiseshell Kitten Female

1st & BOB – Stephenson's TOGHAR SPLASH OF PANACHE (37h) 16/05/09. A well grown baby of very good type. Stylish little head with very good top line and large nicely flared ears set to balance. Good shape and set to eyes, albeit held marginally wide, colour olive green. Slight dip to profile over nose, chin has good depth but slopes back a touch, bite level. Firm toned and weighty body of good length with long slender limbs and neat spoon paws, whippy tail needs an inch to balance. Chocolate tortie coat a touch dark on the body, better on the head, but overall very warm in tone with mid mingling throughout, sound to roots and with excellent sleek texture for a baby. The sweetest temperament, excellently presented.

2nd – Matthews & Pugh's BABADAG BETTYBOO (37e) 14/04/09. Neat and dainty little baby of good type but rather small for 8 months. Shorter wedge with good top line and fairly large ears well set. Olive green eyes that were marginally full but of

good basic shape and set. Profile shows a marked dip with nose almost retrousse from the side view, chin okay and bite level. Dainty but firm toned body of very good length, fine limbs and neat paws, tail quite whippy and almost balances. Dense black tortie coat well mingled with mainly pale red, apart from a completely black area on her bib which was unusual. Good close texture to coat and sound to roots. Excellent temperament and presentation.

3rd – McDermid's LORIMNAILIE REGAL RUMPUS (37e) 16/05/09. Almost adult, of a good size and with fairly good type. Medium length wedge that was a touch narrow at the top, ears in proportion, set to follow but a mite close for balance. Eyes full in shape and rather lacking oriental expression, colour bordering on amber with green just seen on the inner rim. Straight profile, chin slopes away and bite is overshot. Firm toned and weighty body of good length with slender limbs and oval paws, tapered tail needs a touch more length to balance. Super coat, dense glossy black beautifully mingled throughout in mid and rich shades of red, very sound and of excellent sleek texture. Rather wriggly but not unfriendly. Excellently presented

Oriental Cinnamon Neuter Male

PC & BOB – Lowell's GD PR SUSPIRA WILLIAM BECKFORD 21/04/07. A large person of good type. Rather heavy and slightly rounded wedge of medium length, top of head good with proportionate ears set to follow. Good basic shape to eyes perhaps a touch full, setting good and colour very good. Almost straight profile and good chin with clean level bite. Good length to body but he really does need to fine down somewhat as it spoils his elegance, long strong limbs, tail needs an inch and has a small "something" at the tip. Cinnamon coat colouring looked a touch dark but was rich in tone, it was a little unsound on the lower sides, coat length and texture good but it had a little more "body" than ideal to it today so did not lie as close as it could. He is such an endearing boy with a temperament that is second to none. Excellently presented.

Red Point Siamese Adult Female

CC & BOB – Webster's CH JOHPAS GOLDEN SILKA 25/02/08. Now this I had fun with, she was very difficult to handle and I thought for a while I would not manage to do so, but, with a bit of luck and some bravery on my part, I did - just. Of stylish type with very good head and large flared ears very well set. Oriental eye shape and set with very naughty expression and mid blue colour. Good profile and chin, bite a little untidy with the odd incisor missing but level. Slender but fairly weighty body of good length, long slender limbs and spoon paws, tapered tail almost balances. Points colour a touch pale but bright in tone, minimally shaded warm white coat of rather soft fine texture, it laid better after some smoothing and I suspect the openness was due her temper rather than anything else. Excellently presented.

2nd – Stokes' LITTLEFEAT ROSARITA 14/11/07. This lady is quite stylish, albeit rather dainty. She has a good top to her medium wedge and her ears are of a very good size and set, unfortunately her eyes are very full, they tend to dominate the head, and the colour is a good deal paler than ideal. Profile and chin good with level bite. Long slender body with dainty limbs and neat paws, long whip tail to balance. Mid red points, a little dull in tone. Short close coat of very good texture with minimal shading to tone. Very shy but handled well. Excellently presented.

MISCELANEOUS CLASSES

A.C. Oriental Limit Adult

1st – Rathbone's BELLIS COPPER (29) F 13/09/07. Of good overall type, but she has several problems. Her eye colour is not correct for the SOP being almost amber, and her chin is rather weak – although bite is level. Coat colour dark but shows some warmth, very unsound today. Sweet tempered.

A.C. Oriental Breeders Kitten

1st – Siviter's MICHANT LITTLE-MISS-DUFFY (48 40h) F 21/05/09. For type and style this baby is very promising. One eye looked a little smaller than the other but this may have been an illusion due to one being covered by chocolate and one with white, the colour could be deeper, possibly due to the amount of white but she does tend to squint at present. I am not convinced that she has sufficient white, she will need to shade up as an adult before one can be sure, but she does have white in all the right places. Handled well.

A.C. Radius Kitten

1st – Siviter's MICHANT LITTLE-MISS-DUFFY (48 40h) F 21/05/09

A.C. Oriental Self Neuter

1st – Lloyd's SEIDO SPEEDWAY (37) MN 13/04/08. A handsome boy with stylish head type, perhaps a touch over fine in the muzzle, but top of head very good and his large ears are set to balance. Glossy black coat of very good length and texture, sound to roots, slightly sparse area on the flanks but better than when we last met. Excellent temperament.

Siamese or Balinese 32 Series Adult

1st – Hirst's TOGHAR BYDESIGN (32/3) M 12/10/08. This boy looked very good today. He continues to mature nicely and as long as he relaxes and keeps his ears down he looks very well balanced overall, but then relaxing isn't his problem, he is so lovely to handle. Super tabby markings in rich warm chocolate. Presented to perfection.

2nd - Webster's CH JOHPAS GOLDEN SILKA (32a) F 25/02/08.

3rd – Viggers' JOMESE JELLCLE MOON (32/5) F 30/11/08. A very stylish and attractive girl, but unfortunately she has a very undershot bite – the deep pugilistic chin gives it away I'm afraid.

A.C. Siamese/Balinese Senior Adult

1st – Green's IMP GD CH MAPU ALLEGRA (24n) F 30/10/04. A quality mature lady of very good type and wonderful points colouring. She still retains her excellent, minimally shaded off-white coat and the texture was super today too.

2nd – Gibbons' CH RICHDAL SH TIN (32/1) M 25/09/06. A very shy lad of good type. Strong top to his head with very large ears, showing a pronounced pinch to muzzle today which rather spoiled the evenness of the wedge. Very good shape to eyes but they could be more oriental in slant, colour good. Excellent musculature to long body. Needs better tail rings.

Siamese or Balinese 24 Series Kitten

1st – Atkinson’s SENSAY SOBRIETY (24c) F 26/02/09. A promising girl, well grown and strong for a female. Stylish head with very large ears, but wearing her “flat cap” today. Eye shape good, a little straight set at present, colour very good. Points colour very dubious, no sign of the required pinkish overtones and leaning towards lilac-based caramel I think, so keep an eye on how she develops. Excellent temperament.

A.C. Siamese or Balinese Novice Kitten

1st – Stokes’ Dainty baby, rather on the small side but very promising for type. Stylish head and oriental shaped eyes well set, although colour could be quite a bit deeper. Typical baby growth dips to profile as yet which should straighten. I note he is monorchid at present. Points colouring a good bright red on the ears and tail with just a smidge on the nose as yet. A dear person.

A.C. Siamese or Balinese Limit Kitten

1st – Hutchins’ MAFDET MCARTHER (32/8) M 23/04/09. A very promising baby but a bit diddy for his age. Super head with wide top and large flared ears excellently set. Lovely eyes for shape set and depth of colour. Very good tabby markings, caramel colour appears to have improved since we last met although it is still quite “pretty” looking for caramel. No sign of his missing equipment.

2nd - Ellis’ MEILAND MISTER FINLAY (24) M 02/03/09. A well grown and stylish boy. Well balanced and stylish head with oriental shaped eyes, colour needs a little more depth for perfection but is acceptable. Very good substance body, tail almost balances and has a very tiny “something” at the tip. Good warm points colour. Excellent temperament.

3rd – Payne’s GENETTA DCI TAGGART (24a) M 25/01/09. A sweet boy of fairly good type but he does need a little more width between his ears for balance. Very good eye colour but he tends to squint.

A.C. Siamese or Balinese Aristocrat Neuter

1st - Lodwig’s MAFDET MAFIOSO (24) MN 04/10/08. Inordinately handsome lad, still to mature. Lovely head and very good eye shape with snooty expression, colour could be a mite deeper. Points colour dark and dense, with just enough warmth to be acceptable. Coat length good, texture a touch soft today, fairly heavily shaded for a youngster but there is sufficient contrast. Perfect to handle and excellently presented.

A.C. Siamese Balinese Limit Neuter

1st – Smith’s TOGHAR RED ADARE (33a) MN 11/12/08. Extremely stylish lad and well developed for 9 months. Eyes a touch exaggerated in shape, but then he was so cross he was making them look worse. Excellent rich vibrant points colouring. A naughty boy today.
