OPEN CLASSES

A.C. GD CH Oriental Adult Male

IMP – Johnson & Norman's GD CH INLAY JOOP VAN SCALINDJO (48) M 28/06/05. Not much more that I can say about this lad, I have judged him so many times. His type is very good, not over typy but he is very correct and has quite a noble look about him. Balance of white to black is very good and he is turned out beautifully as always, with minimum bleeding to the edges. Very easy to handle.

A.C. GD CH Oriental Adult Female

IMP – Debowska's GD CH CHAPELROSE CINDERELLA (37) F 25/06/09. A beautiful little queen, perhaps a little too dainty for my personal preference but she has so many other good qualities. Lovely type and style to head with excellent top and very large flared ears set wide. Excellent eye shape and set, with snooty expression and vivid green colour. Straight strong profile and firm chin, bite a little uneven. Long slender body with good weight for size and a good firm tone to it, long fine limbs and neat paws, whippy tail to balance. Glossy black coat that was completely sound to roots, really short, and with very good close texture. Excellent temperament and presentation.

A.C. Siamese/Balinese Adult Female

IMP – Richards' GD CH DEBIKAT GRACIE-MAE (32/1) F 02/04/08. A most attractive little queen, she has such lovely eyes with that true Siamese expression. Well balanced medium wedge with very good top of head and large nicely flared ears set to follow. Very good depth of eye colour and brilliance of tone. Almost straight profile, chin very prominent, bite lacks incisors. Well covered and surprisingly substantial body, dainty limbs and paws, tail needs length to balance. Generally good tabby pattern, scarab a little indistinct, but thumb prints, cheek ribbons, bracelets and well ringed tail well defined. Very good contrast to coat, lightly ticked overall, length and texture very good. Excellent to handle and beautifully presented as always.

R – Brock's GD CH KEVELS PURRSONALITY (24) F 21/12/07. I have always rather liked this lady, she is, overall, a very even and well balanced girl, without undue exaggeration. Medium length wedge with good top and fairly large ears set to balance. Good eye shape and set with mid blue colour. Almost straight profile and good chin with level bite. Good length to body that was well covered and firm in tone, neat limbs and paws, tail needs an extra inch to balance. Warm seal brown points with rich warm stockings, creamy coat only very lightly shaded thus excellent contrast for a mature seal, coat texture short sleek and close lying. Perfect to handle, there is something very endearing about this queen. Excellently presented.

British Black Silver Tabby Kitten

1st & BOB – Latimer’s TYLIQUER J’ADORE-DIOR (18) F 30/11/10. A well developed baby of overall good type. Neat well rounded head with ears a touch large and set marginally close at present. Rounded forehead curving to short broadish nose, chin good and bite level. Round eyes with open expression, colour tending to gold when she was out of the pen, although she does have a narrow green inner ring about the pupil. I did consider withholding the BOB, however the lighting was not particularly helpful, and back in the pen the colour looked somewhat better. Medium length body with good substance, short limbs and neat round paws, medium length tail. Fairly dense black tabby pattern with all elements well defined, the butterfly, three well separated spine lines, oysters almost match, on mid silver ground, overall reasonably sound for a silver cat. Shows some slight tarnishing to the muzzle and front paws. Coat marginally long and baby soft in texture. Excellent to handle and very well presented.

Oriental Caramel Neuter Male

IC & BOB – Falconer’s KYOMI HONEYBEAR (37) MN 12/02/09. A huge chap yet still retains his elegance, type very good. Strong head type with broad top line and huge wide based ears that he tends to bonnet. Oriental eye shape set and expression colour rather yellow toned but a little green can be seen. Strong profile with broad nose, firm chin and level bite. Excellent muscle tone to body for a neuter, really long and strong, with long limbs and tail to almost balance. Wonderful caramel colour to coat, lilac-based with excellent brownish overtones, some ghosting evident on the sides but mainly sound. Excellent texture beautifully short sleek and close. Rather grumpy today but handled okay, excellently presented.

Seal Point Siamese Neuter Male

Judged for BOB only and awarded – Gourley & Ward’s GD PR DAZZLING BEN HUR (24) MN 15/09/05. A handsome neuter boy of very good type. Medium length wedge with broad top of head and large open based ears set wide. Oriental eye shape and set with gentle expression, colour mid blue that could ideally be a little deeper for a seal. Good profile and chin with level bite, small pinch to muzzle. Long body with excellent substance and condition, long elegant limbs, tapered tail needs an inch to balance. Dense warm seal points, warm toned coat but heavily shaded, contrast just seen, coat length and texture excellent. Fabulous temperament, a big time waster, obviously a dearly loved boy. Excellently presented.

MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

A.C. Oriental Self Adult

1st - Debowska’s GD CH CHAPELROSE CINDERELLA (37) F 25/06/09 (See Cambridgeshire report)

2nd – Bailey’s CH WESTGARTH BATOUTOFHELL (37) M 22/09/09. A handsome lad of good type, masculine and mature. Strong head with large well set ears. Oriental eyes of pale green colour. Good coat for length and texture, a dense back that was sound to roots. Excellent to handle.

3rd – Simpson’s SHERMESE KUDOS (37) M 28/05/10. Another handsome lad, very stylish. Hazel green eyes and lovely warm cinnamon colouring to coat, but you

can see his ticked ancestry quite clearly in the unevenness of it at the moment. An easy boy to handle.

A.V. Debutante Kitten

1st – Maish’s BARDSONG CHIKUAIORLANDO (37fn) M 15/08/10. Lovely size to this lad, type good, although he has a slightly innocent look to his hazel eyes at present. Superb coat qualities, rich hot apricot colour, albeit showing lots of spotted pattern at the moment, but which hopefully will become less as he matures, and the texture is gorgeous, very short and close lying. Beautifully presented.

2nd – Meelings’ LEMENTAL CHIHIRO (61h) F 09/11/10. A dear Bali baby of good type but completely overawed by it all, which did her no favours as she was widening her eyes like gob stoppers. She looked so much better when she relaxed a little, colour could be marginally deeper. She has good sized ears for a Bali, they were prettily tufted and furnished, and set well. Mid chocolate tortie points developing well. Coat length promising for age, very baby fine at the moment. Excellently presented.

3rd – Pounds’ DEBIKAT BLUESURPRISE (24a) F 26/10/10. This baby has very good type and style, her eye colour is excellent a deep sapphire blue, and her points area lovely pale blue. She is rather small for 6 months but has a good solid feel to her, hopefully she will develop. Excellent temperament.

A.C. Oriental Non-Breeders Neuter

1st - Falconer’s KYOMI HONEYBEAR (37) MN 12/02/09

2nd – Midson’s PR MYOKO SUPER-TROUPER (48 43bs) MN 21/11/08. A very elegant Bicolour neuter boy. He has a well balanced head, a very long slender but weighty body and a super long whip tail to balance. Predominantly white with van patterned areas to top of head and tail. Immaculately presented.

3rd – Whiston’s LEBRETON CHEYENNE PLAINS (48 40) MN 06/07/06. I do love the type of this chap, it is such a pity he lacks enough white for the SOP, in ever other respect he is excellent, with very good depth of eye colour for the breed. Handled really well as always.
